Celebrating 10 years of VISP in 2022


Launched in 2012, the Visiting International Student Program (VISP) welcomes international students interested in short-term, nondegree study at UW-Madison. Traditional track VISP students enroll in courses from across the university curriculum on a space-available basis.

Expanding the scope of VISP, the Thematic Track program allows for focused study within a hosting UW-Madison department. Some departments encourage their thematic track participants to apply for a subsequent graduate degree program to further enrich their academic journey at UW-Madison.

VISP in the Numbers

- Over 3,500 former participants from 44 countries
- Over \$50 million in revenue to campus
- 250+ international partnerships
- 25 VISP Thematic Tracks created
- Average UW-Madison GPA of 3.4
- 950+ students receiving a 4.0 GPA
- 700+ VISP participants later joined one of 54 different degree programs in nine UW-Madison Schools & Colleges.

Summer Highlights

- Average summer VISP enrollment of 60 students.
- Growth in Thematic Track options continues with past groups in departments of Agricultural & Applied Economics, Civil & Environmental Engineering, Electrical & Computer Engineering, Engineering Mechanics, English as a Second Language (ESL), Finance, Mechanical Engineering, Political Science, and Statistics.
- Collaboration with Summer Term on recruitment efforts as well as creating additional student support services.

VISP Program Snapshot for Academic Year 2022-23

Student Profile

- Enrollment for Fall: **122**, Spring: **131**
- 78% undergraduate level, 22% graduate level
- 50% made up of **Thematic Track programs** from the College of Agricultural & Life Science, School of Education, College of Engineering, and the College of Letters & Science.
- Average UW-Madison GPA: 3.58**

Enrollment Changes due to COVID-19

- 39% decrease in enrollment from academic year 2019-20, but up 38% from 2021-22.
- Online-only option allowed continued enrollment from countries where travel continues to be restricted.
- 88% of VISP students during AY 2020-21 enrolled online from home, down to 7% in 2022-23.
